SAT10 for Grades 1-2 Starts Monday, April 12th Be On Time!

The Stanford Achievement Test (SAT 10) will be given to 1st and 2nd graders starting Monday, April 12th. Passing this basic test is important and is part of the decision to promote students to the next grade level. Make sure your child is present for testing. Children do significantly better on tests when they take the test with their class rather than in a make-up test setting. Help your child do his/her very best. Parents can help by making sure students are relaxed, rested, and have a good breakfast on test days. Please put these dates on your calendar and make sure NOT to plan any activities outside of school on test days!

You and your family are cordially invited to join your child's class for this event from 5:30-7:30 p.m. The evening will start at 5:30 in the auditorium with a general meeting that includes greetings and a budget presentation from Mr. Hornbeck and information from your PTO. The final part of the evening will be a special scavenger hunt that takes you to stations in the Food for Life classroom, library, computer laboratory, music room and gymnasium. In an effort to encourage students and their families to come to school on time and show good effort during testing weeks, we held a rally and two raffles. The MSA rally was held outside on the blacktop. Students in grades PreK-5 watched our middle school students cheer and "step" and then voted on the best performance. Make sure to note if any of your child's teachers are indicating if your child is performing below grade level and/or is requesting a conference. Lottery for Admission

Our annual public admissions lottery was held last month. It was supervised by BCPSS staff and the Baltimore Curriculum Project, our charter operator. Names were drawn and placed in available slots in the order in which they were drawn. In all grades, there were more students than spaces available, so a waiting list was established. Families expressing interest in attending for the 2010-2011 school year from this point forward will be added to the waiting list on a first come, first serve basis.

The lottery does NOT apply to students who reside within our attendance zone. Students that live in our attendance area are permitted to attend no matter how long the waiting list. There may be a few middle school spaces available as spring and summer arrive, but the demand for these spaces is much greater

HHA is a No Bullying Zone

Our faculty is focused on providing a safe school environment conducive to learning for each student. Our safe and friendly approach to teaching and learning is one reason why so many families choose to send their children to Hampstead Hill. Harassment and/or intimidation (bullying) means conduct, including verbal conduct that creates a hostile educational environment by substantially interfering with a student's educational benefits, opportunities, performance, or with a student's physical or psychological well-being. Examples of bullying include: (1) hitting, kicking, shoving, spitting, hair pulling, or throwing something; (2) getting another person to hit or harm the student; (3) teasing, name-calling, making critical remarks, or threatening,

in person or by other means; (4) demeaning and making the victim of jokes; (5) making rude and/or threatening gestures; (6) excluding or rejecting the student; (7) intimidating, extorting, or exploiting; and (8) spreading harmful rumors or gossip.

We must work together as faculty, parents and students to create a caring, consistent and just community where none of these behaviors are tolerated. The

Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE), the Baltimore City Public Schools (BCPS) and Hampstead Hill Academy (HHA) do not allow bullying. If you see or hear about an instance of bullying in or around HHA, please let a faculty member or administrator know immediately. HHA implements school-wide rules and consequences, which are posted in each classroom and published in the parent handbook and online at www.hha47.org.

Students Should Go Home After School

No student should be on school property unless he/she are supervised by an adult. This is especially true after school. Students are not permitted to be on school property, which includes the entire block, without adult supervision. Feel free to contact the main office if you see one of our students without adult supervision.

From STEM to Stern

Over seven weeks, from January 19th to February 26th, a group of HHA middle school students participated in the Voyage of Exploration, Living Classrooms' STEM-based program funded by the National Science Foundation and based at the Frederick Douglass - Isaac Myers Maritime Park in Fells Point. Through fun, hands-on projects and science experiments, students explored how maritime trade and innovations in engineering and technology in navigation, propulsion and ship construction throughout history have changed the world.

Some highlights from HHA's voyage included: students making their own half-hull models in the boat shop to study proportion and hull design; working with putt-putt steam boats to examine stream propulsion; and working with compasses in line of sight navigation. Utilizing state of the art equipment in Maritime Park's Bernstein Digital Arts Center and Computer Lab, students filmed and edited slideshows of their voyage. Students also visited LCF's Masonville Cove Environmental Education Center where they studied the environmental impacts of shipping including invasive species through ballast water and the different methods of cleaning up fuel spills. According to Nerissa Daniels, Voyage's Program Director, "HHA was a phenomenal group to work with. The students were extremely inquisitive and self-motivated, and we hope that HHA returns for another voyage next year!"

The sun is shining and the days are longer. Spring barbeque season is upon us. Grilling can be fun and healthy if we make sure a fair share of the food is healthy vegetables. Burgers are great, but nothing brings out the great flavor in vegetables like grilling. Try these vegetable kebabs as a delicious side dish, or add chicken or fish to make it the healthy star of the menu.

Recipe of the Month

Veggie Kebabs

Ingredients:

- 3 bell peppers, seeds removed and cut into chunks
- 3 medium zucchini, cut into 1-inch chunks
- 1 medium red onion, cut into eight wedges
- 1 box white mushrooms, stems trimmed and wiped with a damp paper towel
- ¼ cup vinegar
- 1 tsp. Dijon mustard
- ½ tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. crushed garlic
- 1 tsp. honey
- Black pepper to taste
- ¼ cup olive oil
- 1 can pineapple chunks in juice, drain the juice



Directions:

1. Soak 15-20 wooden skewers in water while you prepare vegetables.
2. Prepare all vegetables and place in a large bowl.

3. In a separate bowl, whisk together vinegar, mustard, salt, garlic, honey, black pepper, and olive oil.
4. Pour dressing over vegetables and toss to coat.
5. Make kebabs by spearing vegetables and pineapple on skewers and placing on a metal baking sheet.
6. Cook on a hot grill for 15-20 minutes, or until vegetables are cooked to desired doneness. If you don't have a grill, you can roast them in a 400 degree oven for 15-20 minutes.

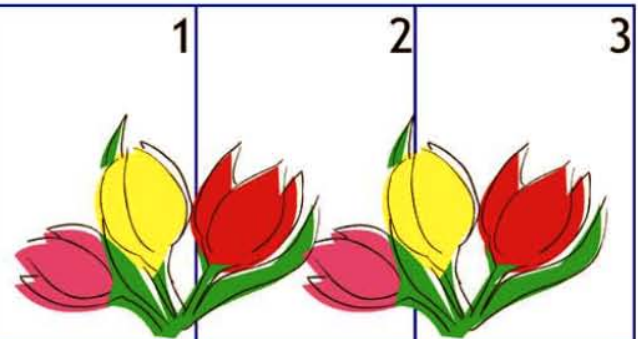
