Are You Paying Too Much Rent? Would You Like to Own a Home?

If you are interested in a zero (0) interest loan to purchase a Habitat for Humanity home within walking distance of Hampstead Hill Academy, please see Mr. Hornbeck. Mike Mitchell, CEO of Habitat for Humanity of the Chesapeake, recently made a presentation to Mr. Hornbeck and other staff. Mr. Mitchell described a new project to restore homes in our part of the City. Up to 30 homes will be available to Hampstead Hill families. The average cost to restore these homes is \$150,000. The work is first rate and includes central air conditioning. The homes are sold to eligible families for about \$100,000 with a zero interest loan. In order to qualify, you must make between \$14,375 and \$41,050 a year, depending on how many people are in the household. You also have to contribute about 300 hours to help with the construction of your new home and take 50 hours of financial and homebuyer education classes. Homes will be ready to move into sometime in the fall of 2010. You can find out more information at

Garden for Life Dedication

On May 27th, during the final evening of Hampstead Hill Nights, HHA's organic vegetable, herb and native plant garden was officially dedicated as the "Garden for Life." Staff, students, parents and community members were joined by city dignitaries to unveil recent improvements to the garden, and dedicate the space to the health and education of the school and community. Baltimore City Councilman Jim Kraft, Baltimore City Food Policy Director Holly Freishtat and Baltimore City Public Schools Director of Food and Nutrition Anthony Geraci participated in the dedication. The improvements, funded in part by a Lowes Charitable Foundation grant, include a new arbor, rain barrels, benches, a tool shed, blueberry bushes and student artwork. These additions will provide even more fresh produce to students and families, enhance the beauty of the community, and demonstrate sustainable and cost-effective gardening practices to our neighbors while continuing to serve as an engaging educational space for the school. The parents, volunteers and students who provided all the hard work to improve the garden were acknowledged for their dedication to HHA and the community.

Farewell to the Eighth Grade Students

This is the fourth year HHA has bid farewell to a group of 8th grade students. We are very proud of their achievements this year. We recently learned that 33 of our 45 eighth grade students were admitted to their first choice high school, including City College(1), Poly(20), Baltimore School for the Arts(1), Western(3) and Friendship Academy of Science and Technology(8).

To mark the end of this part of their educational career, the students will be having a variety of celebration activities. On Thursday, June 3, 2010, the eighth grade students will be traveling to Medieval Times. Students must wear their uniforms. They will leave school at 9 a.m. and return by 2 p.m. Students may bring cameras. Friday, June 11, 2010, is the eighth grade dinner dance. Students must come dressed in fancy clothes. Girls may wear party dresses and boys may wear a dress shirt, pants and dress shoes. Students should not wear jeans, shorts or tennis shoes. The dance is from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. Students must be present Friday to attend the dance. On Thursday, June 10th and Friday, June 11th, students will practice for the closing program. All students must be present in full uniform. Monday, June 14th, is the closing program. The program will begin promptly at 8:30 a.m. The doors will open at 8:10 a.m. **All guests must present a ticket at the door.** The doors will close at 8:30 and all late guests must wait until after the processional to enter. We ask that you make every effort not to bring small children.

Students need to dress up for the closing. They should not wear jeans, shorts, tee shirts or tennis shoes. Girls should wear dresses or skirts and blouses. Our theme this year is High School, College and Beyond. Dr. Berkeley will give the welcoming address. Marcus Henry will speak about high school. A former student will speak about college and Julia (Swann) Juskelis will speak about life beyond college. All three of our speakers are former Hampstead Hill students. After the closing program, students will receive their certificates and report card and leave the building.

Middle Grades Project Fair

The Middle Grades Project Fair was held Friday, May 28, 2010. Our students did a fantastic job. Each grade had a focus area. Sixth graders presented information on more than 50 different countries, 7th graders picked a figure from Greek mythology to study and 8th graders chose an influential figure from history. Mr. Hornbeck saw presentations on Barack and Michelle Obama, Jackie Chan, Greece, Jordan, Columbia, Persephone, Artemis, and Oceanus. Students had clearly conducted research and practiced their presentation. Projects received grades from teachers and judges. The projects were judged on content, appearance, writing mechanics, presentation, citations and bibliographies and research.

What a year it's been! It seems like just yesterday we were getting acquainted at Meet Your Teacher day. Suddenly, June is upon us. I have had a fantastic first year at HHA, and I look forward to continuing to learn and explore the fabulous world of healthy foods with you and your child. To me, nothing says summer like a ripe tomato. I patiently wait for the sweet juicy gems to return to my garden and the farmers' market. Here's a light, refreshing salad using tomatoes that will taste great on a hot summer evening.

Recipe of the Month

Tomato Cucumber Salad with Mint

Ingredients:

- 2 large cucumbers
- 1/3 cup red wine vinegar
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 3 large tomatoes, coarsely chopped
- 2/3 cup coarsely chopped red onion
- 1/2 cup chopped fresh mint
- 3 tablespoons olive oil

Directions:

1. Cut cucumbers in half lengthwise; scrape out seeds.
2. Cut halves diagonally into ½ inch-wide pieces, and place in large bowl.
3. Add tomatoes, red onion, mint and oil to cucumbers and toss to blend.
4. Add vinegar, sugar and salt. Let stand at room temperature 1 hour; toss occasionally.
5. Season to taste with salt and pepper.

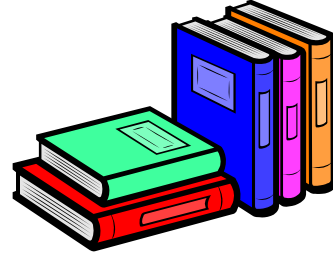

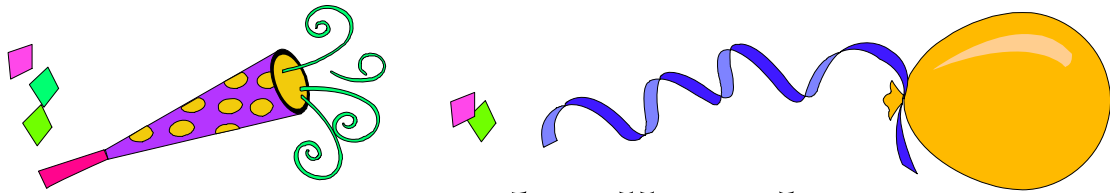
